No prior skills needed

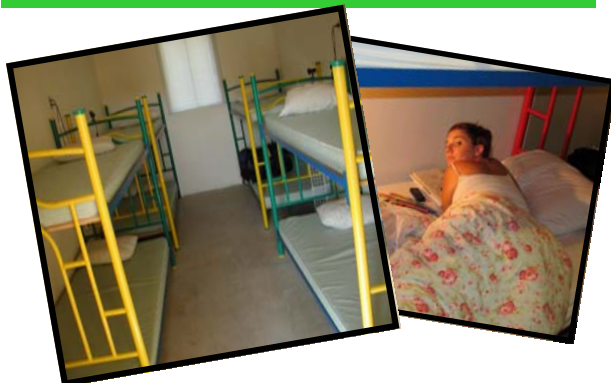
Construction is directed by English speaking Tijuana natives and Spanish speaking U.S. staff.
